

Financial Report through October 2022

We project that we will end the year with a shortfall of \$12,604. This assumes that everyone catches up on their giving, and finishes the year as pledged. This also assumes faithful givers give at their current giving pattern. We would also need to meet our Thanksgiving budget of \$4,000 and our Christmas budget of \$7,500. We will be communicating a Christmas special giving opportunity to help us achieve our budget goal for the year.

Through our first ten months of 2022 our expenses exceeded our income versus our projected budget by \$43,073. This is due to our miscellaneous income and overall giving being less than anticipated.

Our expenses were \$7,931 greater than expected which is within 3.2% of our budget.

On the income side our overall giving was \$12,431 less than our goal to date. Our Faithful Givers were \$844 less than anticipated and our Pledgers were \$11,587 less than our goal. If everyone were to catch up with their pledge and what Faithful Givers gave in 2021, we would be on budget for our giving.

Our miscellaneous income is \$24,757 less than our budget. This is an improvement of \$11,516 due to having the golf outing income included. We also received \$4,300 from the Trustees to cover their expenses year to date. We have received \$4,929 in building use income which is \$3,117 more than our budgeted amount to date.
