"Peace is a Person"

One thing that everyone longs for in life, I would argue, is peace. More than money, health, or success, we all yearn for a deep and abiding sense of peace. Peace is like water to the human body—without it, life becomes difficult, even unimaginable. What good are money, health, or



success if our hearts are restless? Jesus once said, "What does it profit a man if he gains the whole world and yet forfeits his soul?" Peace is the lifeline of every soul. Without it, the soul withers, and with it the meaning of our success and even our life itself.

But how do we find peace—real peace—and keep it throughout our lives? Peace can feel elusive and fleeting. We may feel at peace one day, only to lose it the next. In that sense, peace often seems temporary. Yet what we truly desire is not temporary peace but lasting peace. And to find a lasting peace, we must first understand what true peace really is. How can we find something we do not fully know?

The most important truth about peace is this: true and lasting peace is not merely a condition or circumstance. It is not simply the absence of war, conflict, or worry. True peace is a Person. Just as genuine love is found not in a romantic setting but in a relationship with another person, true and lasting peace is experienced in a relationship with the One who is the author and source of peace. Without this Person, there is no true peace; any peace found apart from Him will fade because it depends on circumstances—and we all know that circumstances constantly change.

God also desires everyone to have this peace. But the peace He offers is not dependent on our situations. It is a peace that can endure even in the most difficult and challenging times. In His love, goodness, and mercy, God made this peace available to all—not by creating perfect conditions for us, but by giving us a Person: Jesus the Christ.

Advent is a season of waiting for the coming of this Person of Peace, preparing our hearts to welcome Him into our lives. And when we receive Him, we come to experience true and lasting peace. Christmas, then, is the celebration of the birth of the One Scripture calls the "Prince of Peace."

It is no coincidence that "peace" is one of the words we hear most often during this season. But in the midst of the commercialized holiday atmosphere, we can easily misunderstand it, imagining peace as the cozy feeling of sitting by a fireplace next to a beautifully decorated tree with wrapped gifts beneath it. Certainly, that is a lovely moment of stillness. Yet true and lasting peace is not found in a scene—it is found in a Person.

My prayer is that you will welcome this Person into your life this Christmas—and in doing so, discover the true peace your heart has been longing for.

Thanks to your generosity, we raised \$1325 for our cold, filtered water campaign. Did we get the ultrafancy totally new water fountain/water bottle filler of our dreams? Nope. The cost to install that option entailed drilling through a 12-inch-thick brick wall and significant electrical and plumbing work. Installation costs would have eclipsed the cost of the actual unit and was beyond budget. That's okay, though - Plan B is fabulous, too! We installed a water filter inside the current unit and a retrofitted the unit with a cup filler. Goal of healthy, filtered cold water met. Bonus? We were also able to install a filter on the sink in our kitchen island. Now we have healthy, clean water for coffee, tea and all our drinking needs. The price tag? \$915.58. This leaves funds to purchase annual replacement filters.


