Have you ever heard of “The Parable of the Drowning Man”? It goes like this:

A fellow was stuck on his rooftop in a flood. He was praying to God for help.

Soon a man in a rowboat came by and the fellow shouted to the man on the roof, “Jump in, I can save you.” The stranded fellow shouted back, “No, it’s OK, I’m praying to God and he is going to save me.” So, the rowboat went on.

Then a motorboat came by. The fellow in the motorboat shouted, “Jump in, I can save you.” To this the stranded man said, “No thanks, I’m praying to God and he is going to save me. I have faith.” So, the motorboat went on.

Then a helicopter came by and the pilot shouted down, “Grab this rope and I will lift you to safety.” To this the stranded man again replied, “No thanks, I’m praying to God and he is going to save me. I have faith.” So, the helicopter reluctantly flew away.

Soon the water rose above the rooftop and the man drowned. He went to Heaven. He finally got his chance to discuss this whole situation with God, at which point he exclaimed, “I had faith in you but you didn’t save me, you let me drown. I don’t understand why!”

To this God replied, “I sent you a rowboat and a motorboat and a helicopter, what more did you expect?”

Although this story is often told as a joke, this funny story can be read as a lesson on missed opportunities in life. The man who drowned had preconceived ideas about how God will save him, i.e. perhaps a miraculous rescue through an angel? The tragedy is that God had already made provisions to save the man. But man’s preconception, biases, and/or stubbornness prevented the man from experiencing God’s deliverance. We can make similar mistakes in our own lives, sometimes without even knowing.

It’s been one month since I arrived at Caldwell UMC as the new pastor. After a month, I feel like walking around wearing a T-shirt that reads, “I survived my first month at CUMC.” These days, my life is filled with many “first timers”—the first time visiting church members, the first time serving Communion, the first time writing for the church newsletter and many more... And of all the “first timers,” perhaps the most significant one is that I am the first pastor in the history of this church who is of Asian American background, a person who is commonly labeled as an “ethnic minority” in our society.

For some in this church, this can feel so different and even strange because its their “first time” having someone like me as their “pastor.” I know how this can feel to some people. But I hope you will not let that stand in the way for you to experience what God has prepared for you and for CUMC. I believe that I am here because, in His love, goodness and faithfulness, God called me to love and serve the people here. I also believe that God has prepared something good for me and my family here as well. To me, CUMC is God’s row boat in my life. And I intend to jump in it wholeheartedly. I will also do my very best to be God’s rowboat, motorboat or helicopter for CUMC and everyone here at CUMC. I invite you to push aside whatever reservations you may have and jump in. Together, we will experience not only God’s deliverance but good and wonderful things that God has prepared for “our church” and “our life together.” Jump in, and let’s go to places! Financial Report through May 2023



Through our first five months of 2023 our expenses exceeded our income versus our projected budget by \$17,301.

Our expenses were \$6,711 less than expected. This is mainly due to Gas and Electric, Buildings and Grounds, Office Administration, and our Ministries running under budget.

On the income side our overall giving was \$1,551 greater than our goal to date. Our Faithful Givers were \$4,963 more than expected and our Pledgers were \$3,412 less than anticipated. This is an improvement over last month. Our miscellaneous income was less than expected and accounts for our expenses exceeding our income.

We will continue to provide updates regarding our financial health throughout 2023.

Thank you for your continued support of our ministries through your pledges and faithful giving.




