"Learn from the Trees"

A few days ago, I stopped by Panera Bread in West Caldwell to pick up a cup of coffee. It was a frigid day, with temperatures reaching only the upper 30s. After getting my coffee, I quickly returned to my car to head home. Just as I settled into the driver's seat, fastened my seatbelt, and prepared to pull out of the parking spot, something caught my attention—the sight of a few trees along the sidewalk near Panera Bread. They were small trees with thin branches reaching toward the gray sky.

At first, I noticed something unusual about them. They looked different from what I expected for this time of year. Almost in disbelief, I leaned forward to get a better look through my windshield. Sure enough, it was exactly what I thought—I saw tiny buds forming on the branches. This sight of tree branches suddenly filled my heart with exhilarating joy and hope. Those budding branches carried a simple yet profound message: spring was on its way! No matter how long and cold this winter had been, beneath the snow and frozen ground, nature had been quietly at work, preparing for a season of renewal and new beginnings. Life was stirring beneath the surface, slowly loosening winter's grip.

For me, the power of nature at work—bringing a season of renewal and new beginnings in ways that are not always evident—is the power of God at work. It is God who designed the natural order to function this way, setting the laws of nature in motion at the beginning of time.

Just as God is at work in nature, He is also at work in our lives in ways that may not always be clear to us. He brings healing to our physical bodies and inner beings in ways we do not fully understand. He moves history forward to fulfill His will and purpose, even when circumstances suggest otherwise. And He is at work making things right, ensuring that all things work for the good of those who fear and honor Him, in ways that transcend human logic and understanding.

The Bible teaches us that "faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." In other words, faith is like looking at tiny buds forming on bare branches on a frigid winter day and seeing the promise of spring, even though it has not yet arrived.

Faith and hope go hand in hand—we cannot have hope without faith. In the winters of life, one thing we need most is faith—faith that God is at work, even when we do not feel it or see it, bringing us new life and new beginnings.
