Financial Report through September 2021

Through our first nine months of 2021 our income exceeded our expenses versus our projected budget by \$12,552. This is due to our miscellaneous income being \$9,945 greater than anticipated. Our miscellaneous income includes \$33,675 which is the full amount of the 2nd PPP Loan we received. As of 8/5/2021 our 2nd PPP loan has been forgiven. This also includes the Golf outing income and expenses without the West Essex First Aid Squad payment.

Our expenses were \$3,948 less than expected. Savings from our personnel expenses and our ministries were the primary areas that resulted in keeping our expenses less than our budget expectations. As of September, we are up to date with our Conference Billings and Shared Ministries.

On the income side our overall giving was \$1,383 less than our goal to date. Our Faithful Givers were \$90 less than expected and our Pledgers were \$1,293 less than anticipated. We reduced the budget gap for pledges by \$2,783 over last month's figure.

We will continue to provide updates regarding our financial health throughout 2021.

Thank you for your continued support of our ministries through your pledges and faithful giving.

Church Seeks New Treasurer

Effective January 1, 2022

If you or someone you know would consider this volunteer position, please speak to the Pastor or any member of the Nominations Committee: Tony Gazzillo, Ruth Carrara, Zorina D'Emilio, Barbara Ingra, Barbara Gordon, Jane Vogelsang.

The Treasurer is a member of the Finance Committee and Church Council. This position manages the financials of the general church budget. They work closely with the Office Manager who performs many of the day to day activities associated with the church finances

The following are the activities associated with the Treasurer's position:

- Signing of checks (90% of the payments are done online)
- Determine how funds move between accounts
- Call in payroll for the staff every other Friday (this takes less than 5 minutes to do)
- Manage the electronic giving through the Vanco web site (Most of this is done by the giver online)
- Creating the annual budget for the general church (This is done once per year)
- Support the annual church audit by providing transaction activity reports to the church auditor(s) annually (This is done once per year)
- Participate in finance and church council meetings. This includes providing financial reports which are reviewed at both meetings. Creating the monthly finance committee status for the VOICE.
- Provide data to be used in completing the annual conference reporting used for determining our Shared Ministry payments to the conference for the following year. (This is done once per year)

NOTE: The current Treasurer will become the Finance Chair and be available for assistance, questions, and training.



Pastored Here 1971—1982




Born May 15, 1932, in Milton, Massachusetts, the oldest of the four children of Edward J. Wynne, Sr., and Charlotte Kingston Moore, Ed was an Eagle Scout, graduated from The Boston English High School, and earned a Bachelor of Science in chemical engineering from Northeastern University. While serving in the Army, he followed his heart to direct his education and career to the ministry. He received his M. Div. in 1962 from the Drew Theological School in Madison, N.J., and Ph.D. from the New York University School of Education in 1971. Starting in 1959, he served the United Methodist Church as a minister throughout northern New Jersey, with his longest tenures in Caldwell and Westwood, and as the first Council Director of the Northern New Jer-

sey UMC's Annual Conference.

His service did not end with his retirement in 1997 and his move to Damariscotta, Maine. He routinely served as interim pastor for a variety of local denominations, conducted countless funerals and weddings, volunteered as a chaplain at Miles Hospital, sang in a hospice choir, and taught courses for the Coastal Senior College. He was elected to Drew University's Board of Trustees for four consecutive terms beginning in 1986, retiring as Trustee Emeritus in 2002 and receiving the Distinguished Alumni/ae Service Award in 2008.

On June 23, 1956, Ed married Bonnie Rae Beukelman, his loyal companion, true partner, and wife of over 65 years. They raised three children and welcomed four granddaughters.

Ed is survived by: his wife Bonnie Wynne; children Janet Owen and husband Hugh of Silver Spring, Maryland, Edward ("Ted") J. Wynne III and wife Elizabeth Hendler of Harvard, Massachusetts, and Roger Wynne and wife Esther Bartfeld of Seattle, Washington; granddaughters Amey Owen of Gainesville, Florida, Kathryn Owen of Laurel, Maryland, Leigh Wynne of Watertown, Massachusetts, and Avigail Wynne of Harvard, Massachusetts; sister Janet Wynne of Newcastle, Maine; and brother Douglas Wynne and wife Judy of Plainville, Massachusetts.

Pastored Here 1988 – 1998

Somerset, NJ: Richard Walter Klein, 83, passed away peacefully surrounded by family Tuesday, October 5, 2021. Richard was a Methodist Minister for 43 years with parishes in Patterson, Randolph, Bloomfield, Vernon, Caldwell, and Livingston, NJ.

During his long career, Richard was a dedicated Pastor and community leader. His accomplishments were vast, and he was most proud of supporting his faith as a Chairman of the Bloomfield Civil Rights Commission, serving as Trustee for the League of Family Services, and shepherding relations between all faiths on the Clergy Association.

Richard was an advocate for all people. He marched with John Lewis and Martin Luther King Jr. in Selma, he supported the LGBTQIA community, he counseled through the Drug Abuse Council in every parish, and he and his family sponsored refugees in their home and parish. He was passionate about children's ministry working as a youth leader for many parishes and always including a separate sermon for the children in the congregation.

He is predeceased by his parents, Viola (MacBride) Klein and Walter Klein. He is survived by his wife, Louise Klein; children Glenn Klein (Patrick Butler), Gretchen Klein, Robyn Casella (Jason Casella); sister Beverly Lausch (Gary Lausch); grandchildren Sara Rhinesmith, Jacob Rhinesmith, Emily Rhinesmith, Julia Rhinesmith, Tyler Casella, and Gwen Casella, as well as many nephews, nieces, grand nephews, and grand nieces.


