Dear Friends,

The writer of these lyrics, Dietrich Bonhoeffer [1906-1945] was a German Lutheran pastor, theologian, founder of the Confessing Movement and anti-Nazi dissenter. He was put to death because of his dissent shortly before the end of World War II.

His many letters and writings are treasured to this very day. I came upon this very rarely sung hymn and was captivated by its poetry. How "wonderfully sheltered" we are each day of our lives, no matter what. I think of baby birds, under their mother's wings. And how even as we huddle for warmth, we are not afraid. Instead, we are "confidently waiting." Waiting because we know that God will not fail us. No matter what.

Some of us may be making the first tentative steps solo without parents as we prepare to go off to college; others of us may be preparing to marry and cannot imagine our love waning but are cautious; some of us are celebrating years and years of partnership with spouse or significant other. Financial Report through April 2022

Through our first four months of 2022 our expenses exceeded our income versus our projected budget by \$15,816. This is due to our miscellaneous income and overall giving being less than anticipated.

Our expenses were \$1,304 greater than expected which is within 1% of our budget.

On the income side our overall giving was \$3,483 less than our goal to date. Our Faithful Givers were \$1,137 less than anticipated and our Pledgers were \$2,347 less than our goal. Our miscellaneous income was \$11,185 less than our budget which is not unusual at this time of year.

Our stewardship drive resulted in an additional \$5,528 in income versus 2021. This is an increase of 3.6% for the remainder of 2022. Please consider a catch-up donation for the months prior to when your 2022 increase took effect. Your catch-up donations could increase the number to \$7,370 or 4.77%. Your increased giving will help reduce the income needed to fulfill the miscellaneous income portion of our budget. We will continue to provide updates regarding our financial health throughout 2022.

Thank you for your continued support of our ministries through your pledges and faithful giving.
